

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF  
THE MACON MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICT  
May 21, 2026**

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The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Macon Mosquito Abatement District was called to order by Travis Wilcoxon on May 21, 2026, at the office of the Macon Mosquito Abatement District at 4170 N. Bearsdale Rd., Decatur, Illinois 62526. Trustees present were Jerry Allen Brown, Jr., Michael Snearly, Travis Wilcoxon, and Greg Foley. Also present were Jason Probus and Attorney Patrick C. Sullivan.

Absent was Lillian Baldwin.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

During public comments, none.

The meeting was opened and a motion to approve the Minutes was made by Greg Foley, seconded by Jerry Allen Brown, Jr., and unanimously approved.

There was a motion made to approve the checks by Greg Foley, seconded by Michael Snearly, and unanimously approved.

DURING OLD BUSINESS, none.

DURING NEW BUSINESS, (A) Discussion of FOIA-related litigation, including potential risks of defending the pending claim. The board directed Attorney Sullivan to offer to settle the claim for the amount demanded on the condition that MMAD have no finding on liability. (B) Discussion of wages for Jason and Alexis. The board discussed wages of various positions in Macon County, rate of inflation, and past raises. Motion by Greg Foley for a 5% increase for Jason and Alexis, second by Michael Snearly, and unanimously approved. (C) Discussion of possible purchase of electric backpack blowers was tabled to June.

DURING DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS, (1) Jason attended the County employee health fair, the ROMEO breakfast, and training for applicators to spread the word about the MMAD; (2) ULV sprayer has been calibrated; (3) Six of the eight summer workers have started, all six are new employees; (4) June

25 set as the annual tire drive event; (5) 5 counties in Illinois have positive West Nile virus cases; (6)

MMAD has identified lone star ticks already this year.
